

Festive Foliage Card (Heat Embossed)

Supplies:

Cardstock/Paper:

- 1-Piece 5 ½" x 8 ½" Cherry Cobbler cardstock, scored at 4 ¼"
- 3-Pieces 1 ½" x 3 ¾" Cherry Cobbler cardstock
- 1-Piece 3 ½" x 4 ½" Evening Evergreen cardstock
- 1-Piece 4 1/8" x 5 3/8" Designer Series Paper (Tidings of Christmas)
- Scrap of Basic White cardstock

Inks:

- Evening Evergreen Classic Stampin' Pad
- Versamark

Stamp Set/Dies/Embellishments/Tools/Adhesives:

- Festive Foliage stamp
- Tidings & Trimmings bundle (Stamp/dies)
- Painted Label Dies
- Gold Embossing Powder
- Cherry Cobbler and Gold Ribbon
- Trimmer
- Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine
- Snips
- Heat Tool
- Stampin' Seal
- Stampin' Dimensionals
- Glue dots

Directions:

1. Adhere panel of DSP to Cherry Cobbler card base
2. Stamp Festive Foliage image on Evening Evergreen cardstock in Versamark ink, cover with gold embossing powder, and set with Heat Tool. Crop this image to 3 ¼" to 4 1/8" – then cut that into 3 equal panels (3 ¼" x 1 3/8"). **I did this to ensure that the panels showed a good image – sometimes when I stamp like this there is too big a border on one edge of the cardstock – this takes care of that)
3. Adhere the heat embossed panels to the small Cherry Cobbler panels and using Dimensionals, adhere to the front of the card base, on top of the DSP.
4. On the scrap of Basic White, stamp sentiment in Evening Evergreen and cut out using die from Painted Labels die set.
5. I cut an 8 inch length of the Cherry Cobbler/Gold ribbon and using glue dots, adhered to the underside of the raised embossed panels (this was tricky – an alternative is to adhere the panels to the DSP, adhere the ribbon around the whole piece and then adhere that to the card base). I adhered the sentiment with glue dots. I then tied a bow with that ribbon and adhered to the left of the die cut label.
